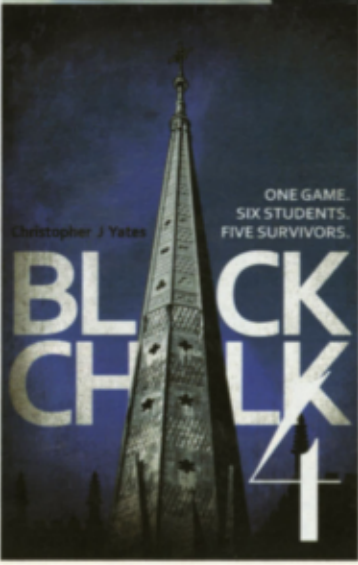
SEE DARK BRITCOM FILTH
